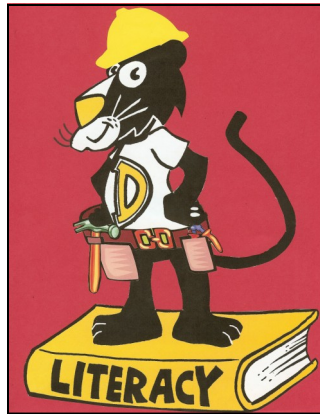
### CONCERT TONIGHT!

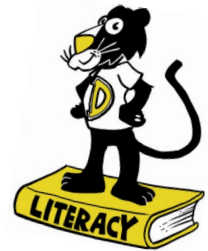
